Narrative

The Social Work and Human Services Area of Emphasis TMC is designed to prepare a student for transfer and for work in the human services field. The core courses are intended to ensure that students are well-prepared for transfer to the CSU and have a foundational understanding of work in the social work and human services. The List A courses offer colleges the ability to

further tailor their degrees to prepare students for transfer or for work. Colleges that opt to develop an ADT based on this TMC should take measures to ensure that students considering graduate school in social work or other human service areas are aware of any additional specific pre-requisite requirements of the graduate programs in which they are interested.

Two concerns emerged during the vetting. The 1st concern related to the requirement of a fieldwork course. The FDRG believed that this experiential course was a really foundational element of this TMC. It was not clear that those who had issues with this requirement had reviewed the descriptor. The descriptor is intended to be broad enough to apply to existing courses. The 2nd concern related to the requirement of a lab course. A lab course is not required – an articulated human biology course can be used. In order to explicitly address the concern, we've specified that the biology course can be any biology course with major preparation articulation – including anatomy and/or physiology courses that do not have a lab.
